In Orange County, 60,000 to 90,000 children are uninsured. With this growing population of uninsured, coupled with government cutbacks, there is great pressure on community clinics, such as Laguna Beach Community Clinic, to provide care. The number of uninsured will continue to rise due to the loss of jobs and the increase in health insurance costs.

Many patients, both insured and uninsured, seek care at LBCC. The majority of the uninsured come from working families who are self-employed or work at jobs that don't provide health insurance.

These people have incomes too low to buy their own insurance coverage. The consequences of not having insurance leads to delays in receiving care, or the person foregoes care altogether. Often, lack of preventive care for the uninsured leads to larger healthcare expenses if the person becomes ill.

In Orange County, estimates of the uninsured range from 300,000 to 500,000, with 60,000 to 90,000 children.

LBCC is a safety net, providing healthcare for low-income families, the uninsured and other vulnerable populations, such as children, the elderly and those with HIV.

Our safety net survives because of our donors, who are committed to helping their community care for those in need.

Of the patients seen at Laguna Beach Community Clinic in 2006, 98% lack private medical insurance. The Clinic staff helps coordinate resources, by accessing governmental programs that will pay for the care that people need to get healthy and stay healthy.

The Clinic safety net provides early diagnosis and treatment as well as education to prevent illness. This helps people avoid emergencies and urgent conditions which can result in a costly visit to an emergency room. Often people use their local ER for treatment of minor illnesses. The Clinic fills that need at a much lower cost, and we offer same-day appointments to those in the greatest need.

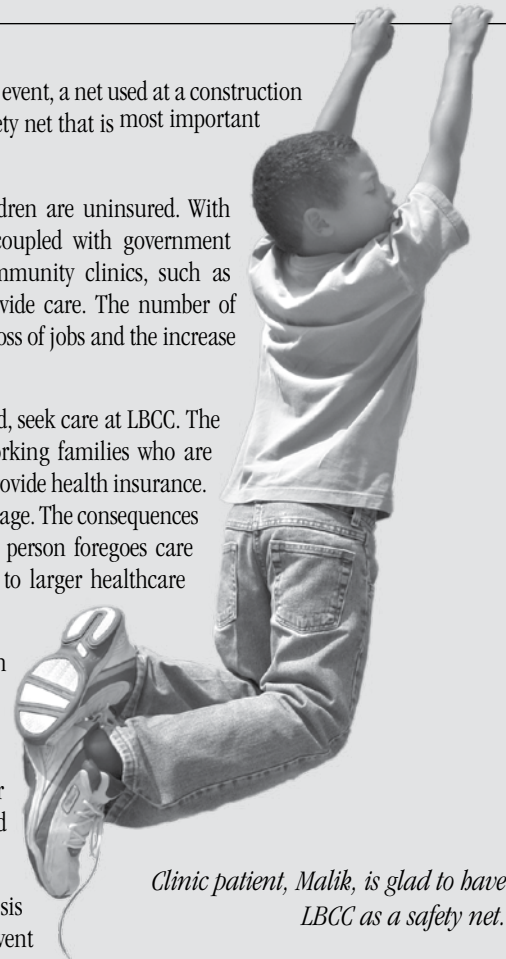
The Clinic focuses on increasing awareness through education and prevention as well as the treatment of diabetes, hypertension and respiratory problems. The Clinic sees adults and children for illnesses such as colds, coughs and sore throats, which affect the person's ability to go to work or school.

Through the years, Laguna Beach Community Clinic has developed longstanding relationships with community health care providers as well as with a dedicated group of volunteers in specialties such as cardiology, gastroenterology, orthopedics, urology, neurology, podiatry, endocrinology, and dermatology.

This safety net survives because of the devotion and caring of our staff and volunteers. It also survives because of people like you, who are committed to helping their community take care of those in need.

Gretchen's legs are getting stronger every day!

Do You Have Any Old IBM Stock?

LBCC will turn it into Healthy Neighbors

Laguna Beach resident, Sylvia J., managed a double-barrel coup when she discovered the Amgen stock she purchased years ago for \$25, was now worth \$5800. To preclude capital gains taxes, she transferred the stock to LBCC's MorganStanley donation account, receiving a sizeable tax deduction. MorganStanley then sold the stock, which provided funding for checkups to keep 52 lower-income OC residents healthy.

Many donors choose to make gifts to non-profit organizations using long-term appreciated stocks and mutual funds due to the attractive tax advantages associated with such gifts.

Benefits that may be available to you when contributing stock or mutual funds to LBCC include:

- Avoiding federal and state tax on the capital gain.
- Receiving an income tax deduction for the full market value of your gift if you itemize deductions on your tax return and have held the assets one year or longer.
- Making a larger gift at a lower original cost to you.

Toni Richter RN, Safety Net for Patients As Clinic triage nurse, she's patients' first contact

"Wanted: R.N. for Laguna Beach Community Clinic. Flexible schedule in a feel-good environment." This small ad in the newspaper seven years ago brought big rewards for the Community Clinic. Fortunately, it was seen by a very special nurse who was beginning to feel the need for a job that would involve more patient contact and would also be nearer to her home in Mission Viejo. Toni Richter, R.N. joined the caring Clinic staff and quickly found her niche.

Toni began by dispensing medicine from the Clinic pharmacy. However, her true value was soon found to be as a problem-solver and case manager who also related well to patients. As the Clinic triage nurse, Toni determines the patient's medical needs and assigns their care to the appropriate Nurse Practitioner or Doctor. She also coordinates financial resources according to the patient's needs.

Toni recently helped a seven-month-old baby girl with a bad rash. The mother was concerned but had no idea how to help her baby. Toni was able to get the baby enrolled in Medi-Cal, find an allergist who diagnosed and treated her excema, and advise a better diet for the child, who soon showed improvement.

Toni's concern for each patient has been known to go beyond the call of duty, such as the time she delivered a needed medication to a patient without transportation to the Clinic.

Toni's Clinic days are busy as she multi-tasks to get everything done. Even though there are many phone calls and records to keep, she finds her work very rewarding. Toni is especially grateful to be working with such a capable staff who have become like a family, working together to provide the best care the Clinic can offer to all who come seeking help.

Proving that for each \$1 spent on prenatal care, \$4 is saved by avoiding complications for both mother and child.
